



**COOPERATION AGREEMENT**  
**BETWEEN**  
**THE LABOUR CENTRE OF THE ORGANISATION OF**  
**ISLAMIC COOPERATION**  
**AND**  
**THE INTERNATIONAL NETWORK OF SAFETY AND**  
**HEALTH PROFESSIONAL ORGANISATIONS**

## **Article 1**

### **Consultation and Exchange of Information**

- 1.1. The Parties shall consult on matters of mutual interest to enhance coordination and achieve their shared objectives in various fields.
- 1.2. The Parties shall exchange documents, research papers, studies, reports, statistics, and other relevant information in the field of labour and employment policies, with a particular focus on OSH standards, competencies, and frameworks.
- 1.3. The Parties shall collaborate in organizing seminars, and workshops on labour-related topics at regional and international levels.
- 1.4. The Parties shall encourage the participation of their members, experts, consultants and specialists in joint initiatives, ensuring technical advice and knowledge sharing.

## **Article 2**

### **Programs and Projects**

- 2.1. The Parties are committed to informing each other of any projects or work programs of mutual interest, with the aim of coordinating efforts and inviting the other Party to participate.
- 2.2. The Parties may carry out joint activities within their respective areas of competence to achieve their common goals, according to terms that are agreed upon in advance, specifying each Party's obligations and the required financial contributions.
- 2.3. The joint activities may include, but are not limited to:
  - Conducting relevant studies and research.
  - Organizing seminars, workshops and scientific meetings.
  - Organizing specialized training courses.

## **Article 3**

### **Commitments of the Parties in Joint Activities**

- 3.1. The Parties shall cooperate in designing and implementing joint programs and activities within their fields of work, according to a specific timeline that is agreed upon in advance.
- 3.2. Each Party shall identify the experts, technical secretariat, and the financial cost required to implement the activities.
- 3.3. Any financial contributions required to implement a joint activity are agreed upon through additional agreement, defining the financial and administrative obligations of each Party.
